#### **PRESENTATIONS**

Downtown B.I.A. 55,12

Mr. George Assally, introduced Mr. Randy Clubb, Manager of the Downtown B.I.A. and informed Council that the Manager had been directed to proceed with a design for a new logo and mascot character for downtown Cornwall.

Mr. Clubb advised that the Board of Management was striving to create a new image for the downtown. In designing the new logo and mascot, the Board took into consideration Cornwall's potential for tourism and the development of the waterfront. The logo will be displayed on flyers, pins and banners. The mascot, Captain Cornwall, will be approximately  $6\frac{1}{2}$  feet tall and is expected to be out on downtown streets by June of this year. Mr. Clubb thanked Alderman Lebano for his invitation to appear at this meeting and Council for their support.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

1. Replacement Workers during Labour Disputes /0.08.0/
It was moved by Aldermen Backs and Poirier that:
Whereas the practice of using replacement workers in legal strike is on the rise in our community;
Whereas City tax dollars are used to escort these replacement workers in and out of work;

Whereas City police officers are called on daily to escort these replacement workers across legal picket lines in and out of work;

Whereas City budgets are getting harder to trim and provincial grants for municipal services are decreasing;

Whereas the potential for violence increases when replacement workers are used, thus increasing the possibilities of Workers Compensation claims by officers and potential lawsuits against the City;

Whereas labour disputes fall under the provincial jurisdiction;

Therefore be it resolved that this Council urges the provincial government to introduce legislation similar to the legislation in effect in the province of Quebec which prohibits the hiring of replacement workers during a labour dispute and;

Be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario for distribution to all municipalities.

2. Relax and Windmill Fort Limited /0.0%.0 1

It was moved by Aldermen Poirier and Lebano that in light of recent developments with Relax and Windmill Fort Limited, be it resolved they be given until the following dates to comply with the City's requirements, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the Site Plan be submitted no later than April 24th, 1989, for approval no later than May 15th, 1989.

- 4. If the building permit date of June 15th, is not met, that Council consider its options.
