DELEGATIONS

1. **Canadian Grand Prix Wrestling**

Mr. Joe Dunlap, promoter for Canadian Grand-Prix Wrestling provided Council with a brief overview of what the Canadian Grand Prix Wrestling provides to the citizens of Cornwall. This organization produces top notched pro-wrestling entertainment as well as wrestler/fan interaction at a very affordable price for the wrestling fans in the City of Cornwall. Their ticket prices are set to accommodate all wrestling fans in the most economical way possible and they have been holding monthly events at the Murphy's Inn since January. However, this location does not accommodate the number of people that have been drawn to the events.

Mr. Dunlap at the conclusion of his presentation requested Council's assistance in providing sponsorship for one day at the Si Miller Arena in order to provide and promote an upcoming C.G.P.W. event. By doing so, the promoter indicated that they would be able to reduce their admission prices drastically. This event would be driven by donations for our local Salvation Army and donations of non-perishable food items for our local food banks.

2. Eco Park

A presentation was made by Mr. Jim Hendry, Chairman to the ECO Park Committee. Mr. Hendry indicated that the ECO Park's goal was to provide an area in the City of Cornwall where residents could learn about nature, relax in a natural setting and grow their own fresh organic vegetables. The main purpose of the presentation this evening was to ask the Council to re-consider its decision in locating the new Curling Club, which is scheduled to be located on the existing park site. A proposed alternative site on the adjacent Water and Race Street location was provided.

Mr. Hendry provided a brief history on the ECO Park project and the values that it brought to our community.

In closing, Mr. Hendry indicated that should the Council decide to hold its decision of locating the Curling Rink on the ECO Park, they consider the following requests:

1. That the community garden aspect of the ECO Park be relocated to a permanently leased secure site and that the shed and fence be moved to the new location.
2. That the city offer local schools, community groups and environmental agencies the opportunity to transplant any of the trees or shrubs for their greening projects; and
3. That should the ECO Park Committee decide to continue, the city would provide the infrastructure, educational program development and promotion necessary for a new site.

3. Pyramid House Sculpture

Mr. Rene Price, a local artist involved in many areas of design, over the past several years, offered the Council an opportunity to display a public art project that he has created and which was partly funded by the Canada Council for the Arts and the Ontario Arts Council upon park land.

His presentation expanded on his experience and background as an artist, the nature of the proposed project and; the significance and support of the project which was received beyond this community.

Mr. Price proposal is to build a life size pyramid house, which would be 27'H x 27'W x 27'D in size. This doll house-style pyramid would be constructed out of modern low maintenance, vandal-resistant house building materials. The sculpture is but a shell and, therefore, no care or function given to the interior. The sculpture is intended to stand no longer than 15-20 years, after which time, the structure will be demolished.

WHEREAS City Council believes that servicing its tenants in the french or english language will not jeopardize the french character of the Logement and will be more reflective of the harmonious community we wish Cornwall to be portrayed as.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the office of the Mayor be instructed to write to the Board of Directors of Logement Marguerite D'Youville on behalf of City Council requesting that the Board strongly reconsider its actions and permit its staff to provide services in English to their English speaking tenants.

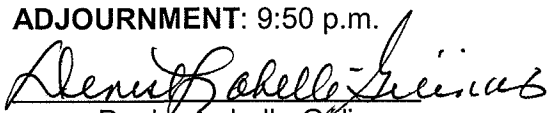

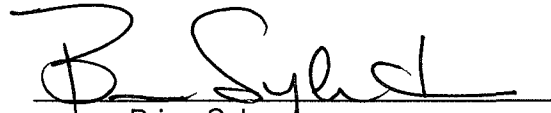
