

CITY COUNCIL NO. 9-72

March 6, 1972.
7:00 p.m.

A Special Meeting of City Council was held this evening with the following members present - His Worship Mayor E.C. Lumley, Aldermen G. Leger, A. LeBlanc, G. Samson, D. Webster, D. Fawthrop, F. Guindon, K. Bough, A. Lebano, J. Pescod and M. Holden.

DELEGATIONJ.A. Villeneuve - Proposed Waterline and Track Road

Mr. J.A. Villeneuve stated that he was representing a number of land owners north of Tenth Street and east of McConnell Avenue. He understood that the City proposes to put in a waterline along Tenth Street to the Boundary Road which would in effect service a railroad immediately to the south. He suggested that the Council consider constructing the waterline and relocating Tenth Street further to the north, thereby servicing industrial land on both sides of a road. If relocating the street is not financially feasible at this time, it could be done at some future date. Mr. Villeneuve stated he felt sure the land owners concerned would be willing to accept the existing road allowance along Tenth Street in exchange for the land required to relocate Tenth Street.

Moved by Alderman Lebano, seconded by Alderman Pescod, that the matter be referred to the Public Works Committee and the Industrial and Commercial Development Committee for further study with appropriate departments.

Carried.

Adoption of Minutes

Moved by Alderman Pescod, seconded by Alderman Samson, that the minutes of a Council meeting held on February 28th be adopted as received. Carried.

Pitt Street Mall

Replying to Alderman Lebano, Mayor Lumley stated that the City delegation with respect to the Pitt Street Mall had met with the Chairman and the Vice Chairman of the Ontario Municipal Board and not junior employees of the Board.

A letter from the Board dated February 28th had not been circulated because once the merchants had emphatically turned down the project, Mayor Lumley did not feel that the matter had to be pursued.

RE #21-72 - City of Cornwall

Moved by Alderman Fawthrop, seconded by Alderman Guindon, that the City of Cornwall be authorized to petition the Department of Transportation and Communications for the Municipality's 1971 road maintenance expenditure funds in the amount of \$1,387,038.27. Carried.

RE #22-72 - City of Cornwall

Moved by Alderman Webster, seconded by Alderman Lebano, that J. Pescod is the City's official representative at National Energy Board hearings to consider the extension of Export Licenses for Cedar Rapids Transmission Company. Carried.

BY-LAWS

By-law No. 1210 - To enter into an agreement with the OWRC with respect to the construction and operation of the Central Western Sanitary Trunk Sewer

1211 - To authorize the construction of a Sanitary Sewer on Cornwall Centre Road from 50 ft. west of Leger Ave. to Ross Ave. - \$25,699.10

1212 - To authorize the construction or extensions to the waterworks system to provide water service to prospective industries and to construct and underground reservoir - \$519,536.42

Moved by Alderman Guindon, seconded by Alderman Pescod, that the by-laws be read a first and second time. Carried.

By-law No. 1210 - To enter into an agreement with the OWRC with respect to the construction and operation of the Central Western Sanitary Trunk Sewer

Moved by Alderman Leba no, seconded by Alderman Bough, that the by-laws be read a Third Time, Passed, Signed and Sealed. Carried.

CMHC Inspection Service




Crossing at McConnell

Mayor Lumley advised that a reply had been received from the CNR advising that a bulletin is being issued to all yard assignments reminding them of the existing instructions applicable to city crossings whether they may be automatically protected or not. This was as a result of a complaint by Alderman Guindon of irregularity while cars were being shunted across McConnell Avenue.
