

CITY COUNCIL - #15 - 77

April 26, 1977

A special meeting of City Council was held this evening with the following members present - His Worship Mayor G. Parisien; Aldermen P. Armstrong, R. Aubry, G. Cameron, F. Guindon, L. Keen, L.G. Lavigne, A. Lebano, A. LeBlanc, B. Lynch, J. Pescod, G. Samson and G. Williamson.

Delegations -


Seaway Valley Tourist Council - Mr. Joe Gunn, member, requested from Council a per capita grant of .15¢ - a .03¢ increase from 1976. He indicated that the Counties had already approved of a similar request. He also stated that the request made represented an increase of \$1,300. from the previous year's amount.

Chamber of Commerce - Mr. J. Cameron, president of the Board of Directors made a request for \$22,830.00. He indicated that last year's amount was \$16,275.00 and that some of the activities to consider for this year were one-shot deals that would not necessitate yearly requests. He recalled with the members of Council the list of proposed activities for the year 1977.

V.O.N. - Miss Beth Davidson made a presentation to City Council in which a request for funds in the amount of \$10,000. was being made. This grant from the City would eliminate the end of the year deficit and would give them operating capital for the year 1977.

Current Budget 1977 - The Commissioner of Finance reviewed all sections of the current budget and indicated to members of Council areas where cuts had been made and gave an explanation for each one. After having reviewed the whole document City Council agreed to meet on Wednesday, May 4th to discuss in more detail each aspect of the budget.
