

CITY COUNCIL #38 - 78

December 4, 1978

The Inaugural Meeting of City Council was held this evening with the following being present - His Worship Mayor G. Parisien; Aldermen P. Armstrong, R. Aubry, Geo. Cameron, F. Guindon, L. Keen, R. Lalonde, A. Lebano, A. LeBlanc, B. Lynch, J. Pescod, G. Samson and G. Williamson.

National Anthem - The Senior Citizens Choir sang O Canada.

Declaration of Office and Oath of Allegiance -

Together with the City Clerk, all members of Council repeated the Declaration of Office and Oath of Allegiance.

Mayor's Inaugural Address -

Mayor Parisien delivered his inaugural address. He stated that the Council term of 1979 - 1980 will be one of challenge and constraint. The challenge will come with the completion of Cornwall Square, the Fly Creek Flood Relief Project, Phase 111 of Centrecore Development with a downtown hotel, continued industrial expansion, Guindon Park Development and a possible zoo and sewage plant expansion.

He continued by saying that the constraint will come in the form of sound financial management, prioritizing capital projects and seeking full co-operation with senior governments for co-operative programs and financial assistance.

Invited Guests - Prayers were offered by Rev. Kelvin Maloney, representing Bishop E. Larocque, Mr. D. Kaye, from the Jewish Community and Rev. Rudolphe Villeneuve, Cornwall Christian Council.

Poirier, Cornwall Chamber of Commerce; Mr. G. Sutcliffe, Industrial Managers Association; Mr. E. Booth, Cornwall & District Labour Council and Mr. H. Reynolds, Cornwall Senior Citizens Club. There was no representation from the Service Club Council.

Comments from Council Members -


Each member of Council was given the opportunity to present their inaugural address.
