

CITY COUNCIL #18-79

May 28, 1979.

The Regular Meeting of City Council was held this evening when the following members were present - Alderman G. Cameron, Acting Mayor, Aldermen D. Armstrong, R. Aubry, F. Guindon, L. Keen, R. Lalonde, A. Lebano, A. LeBlanc, B. Lynch, J. Pescod and G. Williamson. Mayor Parisien and Alderman Samson were attending a Board of Health Convention.

PRESENTATIONS

Paul Montford was presented with a Certificate of Merit and a cheque for \$25 in connection with the Fire Prevention Poster Contest.

Mr. Bruce MacDonald was presented with a certificate from the Eastern Ontario Swimming Pool Operator's Association for successfully completing a course.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Moved by Aldermen Lynch and Lalonde that the minutes of the May 14th Council meeting be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Pescod that the minutes of the May 14th Committee of Council be adopted. Carried.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Pescod that Council go into Committee of the Whole and that all delegations, resolutions, communications and by-laws be referred to that committee and that by-laws 057 to 063 be given first reading -

- By-law 057 - To remove certain lands from part lot control
- 058 - To amend Traffic By-law
- 059 - To amend the Zoning By-law
- 060 - To authorize signing of agreement with Camco Food Services
- 061 - To designate property known as Cline House, 208 Second St. E. as being of architectural and historical value or interest
- 062 - To authorize signing of Grant of Easement with John McMartin Memorial (Ontario No. 297) Branch
- 063 - To prohibit dogs in all city parks and the Pitt St. Mall

RESOLUTIONS

#15 - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Pescod that By-law No. 28/79 is according to the Official Plan of the City of Cornwall; there is no proposed amendment to the Official Plan contrary to the by-law; and there has been no amendment, by-by-law, to the Official Plan which has not been approved which would be contrary to the proposed by-law. - 1. Recreation Committee - Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Lynch that the minutes of May 15th be adopted. Carried.
- 2. Subdivision Servicing Agreement - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Lalonde that Council endorse the proposal to absolve the purchasers of building lots of the obligations as set out in the Subdivider's Agreement subject to certain conditions as outlined on page 2 of the report dated May 9th from the Director of Engineering Services and that by-laws be passed authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to sign acknowledgements with respect to subdivisions as listed on page 3 of the same report. Carried.
- 3. Current Budget, Special Projects - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Keen that Council approve special projects under the Public Works Department where it is deemed advisable to expend approved funds. Carried.
- 4. Cornwall Electric - Moved by Aldermen Aubry and LeBlanc that the City acquire property occupied by abandoned section of railway siding and resell Part 1 to Cornwall Electric and Part 2 to Permanent Concrete. Carried.
- 5. Dog Census - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and LeBlanc that a report dated May 23rd from the City Clerk be received. Carried.
- 6. Tender #23-79 - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Lynch that the tender bid of Lundy Steel Ltd. at a price of \$5,626.21 be accepted for chain link fencing at Glenview Heights Park, Carther Park and Broadview Park. Carried.
- 7. Pedestrian Mall Commission - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Armstrong that the minutes of March 15th be adopted. Carried.
- 8. Pedestrian Mall Commission - Moved by Aldermen Lalonde and Armstrong that the minutes of March 21st be adopted. Carried.
- 9. Tax Adjustments - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Guindon that tax adjustments for the years 1977 and 1978 as recommended by the Tax Collector be approved. Carried.

COUNCIL

The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole reported to Council the actions of the Committee including the second reading of the by-laws and recommendations for enactment.

Committee of the Whole = Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Pescod that the Committee of the Whole be adopted.

The motion was amended by Aldermen Aubry and Lynch by deferring third reading of By-law 63 to the next meeting of Council. Administration was asked to present a further report on the possibility of having dog owners pick up dog droppings. The amendment carried and the motion carried as amended.

By-laws - Third Reading - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Guindon that By-laws 057 to 062 as listed on the agenda for third reading be taken as read a third time and finally passed. Carried.

NEW OF UNFINISHED BUSINESS


Train Service - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Williamson that Administration forward a letter to the Prime Minister elect in order to acquaint him with problems the City is experiencing with rail service. Motion defeated.


Property Acquisition, McConnell - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Williamson that Administration review and report on the possibility of acquiring property along McConnell between Ninth and Tenth, including at the intersection of McConnell and Tenth. Carried.

Refuse Pickup - Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Williamson that the Clerk place a notice in the local newspaper in connection with the placing of refuse by the side of the road for pickup as well as removal of containers after pickup.

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Aubry and Lynch that Administration consider other means of apprising citizens of regulations in connection with refuse pickup. The amendment carried and the motion was defeated.

Fire Chiefs' Convention - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and LeBano that the Mayor send a letter of thanks to the Fire Chief, his staff and the ladies' auxiliary for the excellent organization of the recent Fire Chiefs' Convention held in the City. Carried.
