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CITY COUNCIL #26-81

The Regular Meeting of City Council was held this evening when the following were present - His Worship Mayor G. Parisien, Aldermen D. Armstrong, R. Aubry, G. Cameron, F. Guindon, R. Lalonde, A. Lebrano, A. LeBlanc, G. Leger, J. Pescod, J. Samis, G. Samson and W. Wise.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Lalonde that the minutes of the October 13th meeting of Council be adopted. Carried

Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Lebrano that the minutes of the October 13th meeting of Committee of Council be adopted. Carried

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Moved by Aldermen Leger and LeBlanc that Council go into Committee of the Whole and that all delegations, resolutions, communications and by-laws be referred to that Committee and that By-laws 189 and 190 be given first reading.

By-law 189 - To prohibit possession of liquor at the Civic Complex, the Bob Turner Memorial Centre and the Water Street Arena

DELEGATIONS

To authorize the purchase of land for the National Utilities Service Canada Ltd. - Mr. H.C. Welch, Vice-President, informed Council that his company has been in business for 48 years and has expanded into 11 different countries. The purpose of this presentation was to introduce his company to the City of Cornwall. He indicated that their role would be strictly to monitor the cost of telecommunications, telephones, telex, mobile units, paging systems, etc. He explained how his company would proceed to analyze the present equipment and its usage and prepare a cost control program. He stated that in 90% of cases investigation leads to some form of refund because the client has been paying for services actually never provided. He indicated that there are 19 ways to make long distance calls and that each one has its own tariff. It would be his company's job to help the City select the best possible way. He concluded by indicating that his company would prepare final recommendations for City Council which recommendations would be broken down into savings and how and when these savings would come about. This company would also be available in negotiating the acquisition of equipment and contracts relative to their recommendations. He stated that the initial fee for their service was \$5,000 and they would be on a 50-50 basis on any savings experienced by this service.

Moved by Aldermen Leger and Lebrano that the proposal be referred to Administration for report. Carried

1. Winter Salting, City Streets - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Samis that the Public Works Dept. carry on the salting operation as in the past. Carried
2. Interaction Between Council & Committees & Boards - Moved by Aldermen Aubry and Lalonde that effective October 29th the Planning Board submit recommendations in individual reports for Council action on item by item basis. Carried
3. Fire Department Administration - Moved by Aldermen Cameron and Guindon that Council concur to filling the position of Deputy Fire Chief.
- An amendment was moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Wise to defer the report. Defeated
- A recorded vote resulted as follows -
 For the Motion: Aldermen Armstrong, Pescod, Lebano, Lalonde, Cameron, Guindon, Samson and Aubry. Against the Motion: Aldermen Samis, Wise, Leger and LeBlanc. The motion carried.
4. Raisin Region Conservation Authority - Moved by Aldermen Leger and Aubry that the Raisin Region Conservation Authority be advised that its proposed goals and objectives are satisfactory to the City as a sustaining member. Carried
5. Children's Aid Society - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Cameron that Council grant the Society the sum of \$8,500 to be paid in 1982 as part of the normal year's budget. Carried
6. Bicentennial Committee - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Samson that the minutes of October 14th be adopted. Carried
7. Recreation Committee - Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Lebano that the minutes of October 20th be adopted. Carried
8. Second St. Parking Restrictions - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Wise that Alternative #3 be adopted to retain the existing "No Stopping" restrictions and remove the existing parking meters.

A recorded vote resulted as follows:
For the motion: Aldermen Armstrong, Pescod, Lebano, Samis, Wise, LeBlanc and Aubry.
Against the Motion: Aldermen Lalonde, Cameron, Guindon, Leger and Samson. The motion carried.

Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Armstrong that Alternative #3 be implemented between Augustus and Sydney Streets only.

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Leger and Wise that Alternative #3 be adopted and that parking meters be removed on both sides of Second between Amelia and York Streets. A recorded vote resulted as follows - For the amendment: Aldermen Armstrong, Pescod, Lalonde, Cameron, Samis, Wise, Leger, LeBlanc and Aubry.
Against the amendment: Aldermen Lebano, Guindon and Samson. The amendment carried and the motion was defeated.

- 9. Semaine Francaise - Moved by Aldermen Leger and Lalonde that Council grant the French Week Committee \$600 so that the proposed program can be realized. Carried

C O U N C I L

The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole reported to Council the actions of the Committee including the second reading of the by-law and recommendations for enactment.

- Committee of the Whole - Moved by Aldermen Leger and Pescod that the Committee of the Whole be adopted. Carried

- By-laws - Third Reading - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Cameron that by-law 189 as listed for third reading be taken as read a third time and finally passed. Carried

NEW OR UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Free Parking - Moved by Aldermen Wise and Lebano that Administration prepare a report on the cost of providing free parking 3 days per year as well as every Friday and Saturday in the downtown and Montreal Rd. business areas and that the report be made available at the next meeting. Carried

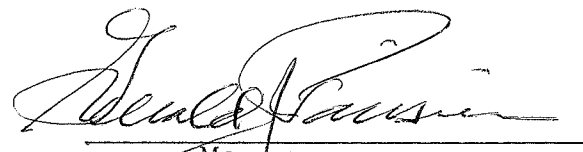
- Walk Light - Moved by Aldermen Samson and Lebano that the Traffic Engineer prepare a report on the feasibility of installing walk lights at the intersection of Second and Cumberland Streets to allow pedestrians better crossing movement. Carried

High Interest Rates - Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Lebano that the City write to the Federal Minister of Housing protesting the high interest rates on mortgages and that the Federal Government be implored to bring about a solution to this problem.
