

CITY COUNCIL #30-81December 14, 1981.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Pescod that the minutes of the November 23rd meeting of City Council be adopted. Carried

Moved by Aldermen Lalonde and Lebano that the minutes of the November 23rd meeting of Committee of Council be adopted. Carried

Karen Roach Delegation - Moved by Aldermen Samis and Wise that Rule 10 be invoked to allow Miss Roach to make representation under Delegations portion of the agenda. Defeated

DELEGATIONS

Seaway Valley Tourist Council - Mr. Ian McIntosh reviewed their activities for 1981. He explained where the City's large contribution was spent and left with members of Council a package containing different publications prepared by the Seaway Valley Tourist Council as promotion for this area. He concluded by indicating that the Tourist Council had generated the sum of \$10,000 on their own but that they would need further support from City Council in order to better promote tourism in this area. Mr. McIntosh was informed that it will be necessary for the Seaway Valley Tourist Council to make a further presentation at budget time in order to determine the amount of contribution City Council will allocate for the year 1982.

Vial of Life - Mr. B. Clark along with Mr. W. Hassall made an official presentation on the purpose of the Vial of Life. Mr. Clark indicated that his group, which also represents the medical profession, is very supportive of this program and would like Council to also support the program and offer a financial contribution in the amount of \$4,600.

Moved by Aldermen Lebano and LeBlanc that the delegation be received and that pending further dialogue between Administration and representatives of Vial of Life representation be made at budget time.

RESOLUTIONS

#52 - Moved by Aldermen Samis and Wise that whereas the Federal and Provincial Governments of Canada and Ontario have enacted legislation to regulate political candidates' financing and election contributions and expenses; and whereas such legislation through control and disclosure is designed to reduce the influence of those individuals or interest groups who through substantial contributions may exert an influence disproportionate to their numbers on election results and decision making by those elected; and whereas the Ontario Government has made specific provision for municipalities to pass a by-law limiting municipal candidates' expenditures and requiring disclosure of any contributions in excess of \$100; and whereas a number of the more progressive municipalities in Ontario have passed such by-laws; now therefore be it resolved that the City of Cornwall enact a by-law under Section 121, Chapter 308 of The Municipal Elections Act setting the following: That each candidate in a municipal election must publicly disclose the identity of any person or organization contributing more than \$100 to his or her campaign and that no candidate be permitted to spend more than \$2,000 in total on his or her bid for an aldermanic position of \$10,000 on his or her bid for the position of Mayor.

After every alderman had an opportunity to discuss this resolution a recorded vote resulted as follows - For the Motion: Aldermen Armstrong, Lalonde, Samis, Wise and LeBlanc. Against the Motion: Aldermen Pescod, Lebano, Cameron, Guindon, Leger, Samson and Aubry. The motion was defeated.

1. Ontario Neighbourhood Improvement Program - Moved by Aldermen Samson and LeBlanc that Council pass a resolution applying for funding assistance under O.N.I.P. in the amount of \$609,365 to complete the Bridge Area, Phase II. Carried
2. Long Term Parking Permit - Moved by Aldermen Lalonde and Cameron that Council adopt a parking "Convenience Sticker Program" effective on all off-street lots that contain 12-hour limit meters, the permit period to be a maximum of three months and a fee structure of \$30 for monthly permit, \$27 per month for two-month permit and \$24 per month for three-month permit, all as outlined in CAO's recommendations a, b and c in report dated December 9, 1981. Carried
3. Planning Board - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Lebano that the minutes of November 24th be received. Carried
4. Planning Report 4-1 - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Lalonde that the fencing requirements in the Highway Commercial zone be amended in certain respects. Carried
5. Planning Report 4-2 - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Samson that the Service Industrial zone be amended in certain respects. Carried
6. Charlottenburgh Township - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Samis that Council support the Township's resolution objecting to the lack of sanction against offending ships travelling the St. Lawrence Seaway. Carried

- 7. Lions Club - Moved by Aldermen Wise and LeBlanc that Council approve the request for a carnival in May, 1982 and that no other carnival be allowed to operate prior to that month. Carried

- 8. Telephone & Telecommunications Monitoring Service
 Moved by Aldermen Wise and Aubry that the City enter into a monitoring contract with National Utility Services (Canada) Limited for a minimum term of 60 months at an initial fee of \$5,000 and a sustaining fee (after \$5,000 is recovered) of 50% of future savings. Carried

- 9. Garbage Collection - Moved by Aldermen Lalonde and Cameron that no change be made to the garbage collection system presently in existence. Carried

- 10. Boathouse Committee - Moved by Aldermen Wise and Leger that the minutes of May 13th be received. Carried

- 11. Boathouse Committee - Moved by Aldermen Wise and Leger that the minutes of July 2nd be received. Carried

- 12. Boathouse Committee - Moved by Aldermen Wise and Leger that the minutes of November 24th be received. Carried

- 13. Existing Landfill Site - Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Pescod that the consulting firm of Water and Earth Science Associates Ltd. be hired to carry out an hydrogeological study and environmental assessment of existing landfill site; that \$9,900 be committed in the 1982 budget and that upon completion of the project the City apply to the MOE for additional funds. Carried

- 14. Environmental Control Committee - Moved by Aldermen Samson and Guindon that the minutes of November 18th be received. Carried

 Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Samis that recommendations 2 and 3 be referred to the appropriate departments for further study. Carried

- 15. Fringe Benefits for Council Members - Moved by Aldermen Wise and Guindon that benefits as outlined in a report signed by Aldermen Wise and Guindon be approved. A recorded vote resulted as follows - For the Motion: Aldermen Lalonde, Cameron, Guindon, Samis, Wise, Samson and LeBlanc. Against the Motion: Aldermen Armstrong, Pescod, LeBano, Leger and Aubry. Carried

- 16. Postal Rate Increase - Moved by Aldermen LeBano and Lalonde that Council support the City of Chatham and the Borough of East York and any other municipalities in their opposition to the proposed postal rate increase. Carried

17. Garbage Collection - Moved by Aldermen Samson and Lalonde that the City continue with its present practice of garbage collection at apartment buildings. Defeated

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Wise and Samis that the matter be deferred pending legal advice. The amendment carried and the motion was defeated. Carried

Committee of the Whole - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Lalonde that Committee of the Whole be adopted. Carried

By-laws - Third Reading - Alderman Samis requested that By-law 209 be voted on separately.

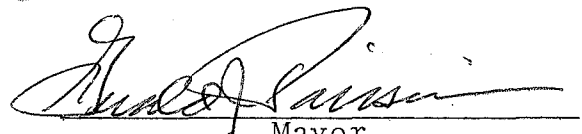
