INAUGURAL MEETING

The oath of office was led by the City Clerk who had the Members of Council repeat the Declaration of Office and Oath of Allegiance as prescribed and collected all Declarations and Oaths duly signed.

Mayor Parisien delivered his inaugural address.

The City Clerk read the list of Acting Mayor for the period of December 1982 to November 1983. He then explained the format for regular and special meetings to be held during 1983 and the remainder of the Council term.

Mayor Parisien had each Alderman rise and read the Committees each member would sit on for the term ending December 31, 1983.




