

CITY COUNCIL #31-83November 29, 1983.  
7:30 p.m.

The Regular Meeting of City Council was held this evening when the following were present - His Worship Mayor G. Parisien, Aldermen R. Aubry, F. Guindon, R. Lalonde, T. Lalonde, A. LeBano, G. Leger, B. Lynch, E. Myers, J. Pescod, J. Samis and W. Wise. Alderman LeBlanc was absent on City business.

Moved by Aldermen T. Lalonde and Wise that Communication #14 be removed from the agenda due to new information that came to light today.

Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Leger that the minutes of the November 14th meeting of Council be adopted.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Myers that Council go into Committee of the Whole and that all delegations, resolutions, communications and by-laws be referred to that Committee and that by-laws 134 to 137 be given first reading -

- By-law 134 - To authorize signing of Agreement with Edgewood Residence (hostel)
- 135 - To authorize purchase of land from Ontario Hydro (landfill site)
- 136 - To authorize signing of easement agreement with Eastern Ontario Health Unit
- 137 - To licence all bicycles and prescribe the fees therefor

Mrs. Huguette McDonald indicated that she was speaking on behalf of the Cornwall public and expressed her disapproval of the present transit level of service. She indicated that bus scheduling was not adequate and that during peak hours certain coaches did not have sufficient seating capacity. She also expressed the opinion that there should be bus service on Sunday and that because of one-hour schedules the City should list the times on the bus stops so that riders would be better informed.

Alderman Aubry declared a conflict of interest because he has a pecuniary interest in the firm that holds the contract with the City for advertizing on City buses. He did not participate in the discussion and the subsequent vote on this matter.

4. Tender #60-83 - Moved by Aldermen Leger and Pescod that the tender for cleaning services for Cornwall Transit be awarded to St. Lawrence Cleaning & Building Maintenance for a period of two years at a total cost of \$13,930.80. Carried

5. Tender #61-83 - Moved by Aldermen Lynch and Guindon that the tender for a four-wheel drive sidewalk tractor be awarded to Holder of North America at a total cost of \$39,170.78. Carried
6. McConnell, Antoine, Gerald & Morris Sts. - Moved by Aldermen T. Lalonde and Pescod that a petition from D. Laframboise and others be referred to Administration for study and report. Carried
7. Bicycle Licence Fees - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Leger that bicycle licence fees be increased from \$3 to \$4. Carried
8. Free Parking, Conventions - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and T. Lalonde that the experiment conducted over the days October 21 - 22 be changed to a practice for all future conventions and that parking passes become automatic to all convention kits throughout the municipality with specific instructions on the said passes that parking is limited to 12-hour meters at all off-street parking lots.
- Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Lebano that passes apply to all meters at all off-street parking lots.

9. Management - Municipal Marina - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and R. Lalonde that the new Municipal Marina operate as part of the City of Cornwall Parks and Recreation Department. Carried
10. Animal Control - Moved by Aldermen T. Lalonde and Myers that the present service level be maintained with two full-time employees and that this level be that assumed for budget purposes for 1984. Carried

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Lynch and Aubry that, at budget time, Council give serious consideration to removing courier duties from animal control officers in order to give them more time for patrol and pound duties.

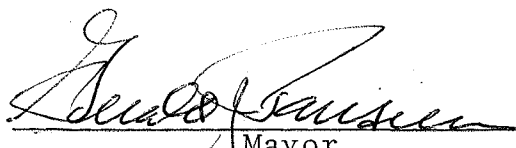
