The Regular Meeting of City Council was held this evening when the following were present - His Worship Mayor G. Parisien, Aldermen R. Aubry, F. Guindon, R. Lalonde, T. Lalonde, A. Lebano, A. LeBlanc, G. Leger, B. Lynch, E. Myers, J. Pescod, J. Samis and W. Wise.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Moved by Aldermen R. Lalonde and Lebano that the minutes of the November 29th meeting of City Council be adopted. Carried

Moved by Aldermen Lynch and LeBlanc that the minutes of the December 5th meeting of City Council be adopted. Carried

Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Leger that the minutes of the December 6th meeting of City Council be adopted. Carried

Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Myers that the minutes of the November 29th meeting of Committee of Council be adopted. Carried

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Moved by Aldermen Lynch and R. Lalonde that Council go into Committee of the Whole and that all delegations, resolutions, communications and by-laws be referred to that Committee and that by-laws 138 to 141 be given first reading -

- By-law 138 - To amend the Zoning By-law (Anchor Motor Hotel)
- 139 - To appoint members of Council to act from time to time in the place and stead of the Head of Council Dec./83 to Dec./84
- 140 - To authorize signing of agreement with the Raisin Region Conservation Authority for access to Gray's Creek marina from Highway 2
- 141 - To grant an easement to Cornwall Electric Carried

RESOLUTIONS

- #56 - Moved by Aldermen Samis and Wise that, if motions under New Business are not heard for two consecutive Council meetings due to time constraints, these motions be placed on the next Council agenda immediately following the Consent Agenda portion.

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Guindon and T. Lalonde that, if motions under New Business are not heard at a Council meeting due to time constraints, these motions be placed on the next Council agenda immediately following the Consent Agenda portion. The amendment carried and the Carried motion carried as amended.

It was moved by Alderman Lynch that New Business items be reinstated if Council meetings go past 11 p.m. and that paragraph 2(2.4) of the Procedural By-law be amended to read "when at any meeting of the Council the hour of 11 p.m. is reached that portion of the agenda dealing with unfinished business and general statements shall be dispensed with". There was no seconder.

#57 - Moved by Aldermen Samis and Wise that the City of Cornwall examine the feasibility of introducing a by-law to require that all upper floor windows capable of being opened in multiple dwelling unit buildings be fitted with suitable locking or latching devices and/or strengthened screens so that children cannot climb or fall through. Carried

1. Left Turn Second & Augustus - Moved by Aldermen Aubry and Pescod that this matter be reconsidered. The motion carried having obtained a two-thirds vote of Council. Carried

Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Pescod that an advanced green indication not be employed at the intersection of Second and Augustus Streets in the westbound direction. Carried

2. Ad Hoc Committee on Day Care Operations - Moved by Aldermen Lynch and T. Lalonde that the minutes of October 18th be received. Carried
3. Ad Hoc Committee on Day Care Operations - Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Guindon that the minutes of November 14th be received. Carried
4. Transient Marina - Moved by Aldermen Aubry and Leger that the Cornwall marina be identified as Marina 200. Carried
5. Heritage Cornwall - Moved by Aldermen Lynch and Lebano that the minutes of November 8th be received. Carried
6. Transit Service - Moved by Aldermen Lynch and Guindon that the Handi-Transit be integrated with the regular and extra street operation; that full evening service be reinstated; and that peak service be reactivated on Brookdale/Second Street Monday to Friday. Carried
7. Transit Service - Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Lynch that a letter from Mrs. H. McDonald be received. Carried
Alderman Aubry declared a conflict of interest because he has a pecuniary interest in the firm that holds a contract with the City for advertizing on City buses. He did not participate in the discussion and the subsequent vote on Communications #6 & #7.

NEW BUSINESS

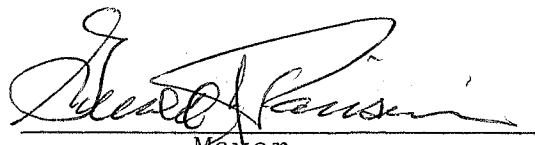

A recorded vote resulted as follows - Defeated

For the Motion: Mayor Parisien, Aldermen Lynch, Samis, Pescod and Aubry. Against the Motion: Aldermen T. Lalonde, Lebano, R. Lalonde, Myers, Guindon, Wise, Leger and LeBlanc. The motion was defeated.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 p.m.



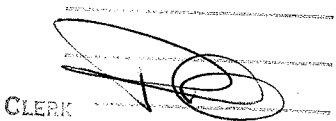
