ADOPTION OF MINUTES

DELEGATIONS

Lions Club Annual Carnival - The spokesman for the club was Mr. George Assaly. Mr. Assaly is requesting that City Council reconsider its motion of the meeting of January 26th where a guarantee was provided for the period of May 1st to June 7th. Mr. Assaly explained to Council that a short history of the involvement of the Lions Club in the annual carnival should be presented. He went on to explain that for more than 30 years now the Lions Club has been associated with Conclin Shows which show has a triple A rating. The Lions Club have a contract with Conclin Shows that is regarded as the best contract in the country in which the Lions Club retains a greater amount of money in order to better service charitable purposes. Mr. Assaly indicated that another similar show presented in Cornwall would hurt the Lions Club in future years. He indicated that over the years the Lions Club and Conclin have always presented clean entertainment in that the rides and other aspects of their activity were always of the safest nature and have never created any problems to the City of Cornwall. The Service Club Council has also recognized the Lions Club's contribution and at their last meeting approved a motion that the Lions Club would be only service club to sponsor carnivals. This carnival represents the number one fund raising project for the Lions Club and that it is one of the reasons they are before City Council asking that the Council reconsider its motion from the meeting of January 26th. At the completion of Mr. Assaly's presentation Mayor Lynch indicated that Council would in fact give consideration to the Lions Club's proposal.

- #3 - Moved by Aldermen Charlebois and LeBlanc that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Cornwall petition the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for subsidy under the provisions of the Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act on expenditures during the year 1986 for roads, streets and traffic signals in the amount of \$4,322,800. Carried

Office Automation & Management Information Systems - Moved by Aldermen Carr and Guindon that the City of Cornwall issue a request for proposals to a limited number of major vendors for the supply and installation of computer hardware and software consistent with the specifications terms and conditions contained in the request for proposal document and that Council approve the summary of the request for proposals contained in Appendix "A" to the report. Carried
5. Deputy Fire Chief - Moved by Aldermen Green and LeBlanc that the position of Deputy Fire Chief be filled and that the position be advertized to the public as well as in-house. Carried

6. Planner Position - Moved by Aldermen Poirier and Guindon that the planning position be filled. Carried
7. Glenview Heights Area Development Proposal - Moved by Aldermen Grant and T. Lalonde that the land described as Area 3 on the plan attached to the report dated January 23rd, being part of Block I, Registered Plan 273, be conveyed to Patlise Development Corporation for the consideration of \$24,000, subject to the following conditions: that the City of Cornwall enacts the appropriate by-law to remove the designation of parkland from Area 3; and that the land may only be developed after an appropriate subdivision servicing agreement has been executed between the City of Cornwall and the purchaser. Carried
8. Ontario Traffic Conference - Moved by Aldermen Carr and LeBlanc that Council formally invite the Ontario Traffic Conference to the City in 1989. Carried
9. Image Improvement and Attitude Adjustment - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and R. Lalonde that the recommendations in the report from the Task Force be adopted. Carried


