It was moved by Aldermen T. Lalonde and C. Poirier that the transfer of the operations of the City's animal shelter to the S.D. & G. Humane Society be approved and that the City Clerk be authorized to negotiate a fee for service contract with the S.D. & G. Humane Society.

2. Community Base Alternatives - New Glen-Stor-Dun Lodge

It was moved by Aldermen T. Lalonde and R. Lalonde that the report on Community Based Alternatives to Long Term Care for the frail elderly and negotiations for the ownership and operation of the new Glen-Stor-Dun Lodge be received.

It was moved by Aldermen Charlebois and R. Lalonde that the Report from the Director of Planning and Engineering be received.

4. Sewage Collection and Water Distribution System

It was moved by Aldermen Charlebois and Grant that Council adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS the Ontario Ministry of the Environment has announced a program to assist municipalities in the rehabilitation of sewage collection and water distribution systems;

AND WHEREAS the Ministry initially proposes to assist municipalities in determining their needs with respect to an infrastructure rehabilitation program;

AND WHEREAS the Ministry has indicated that it will be providing funding for municipalities to undertake studies in 1988;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Cornwall supports the program to determine needs for infrastructure rehabilitation; and that the City of Cornwall proposed to undertake a study in 1988 to determine its needs with respect to the rehabilitation of sanitary sewer systems, at an estimated cost of \$300,000.00; and that the City of Cornwall requests funding from the Ontario Ministry of Environment in the amount of \$150,000.00 towards that study.

5. Flood Risk Maps

It was moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and T. Lalonde that the Raisin Region Conservation Authority be authorized to produce public information flood risk maps as part of the flood damage reduction program which will include all floodplain mapped watercourses within the municipality's jurisdiction, including those watercourses which were mapped outside the flood damage reduction program.
