That City Council receive the request from the Police Commission that City Council provide a new police facility in accordance with the report submitted to the C.A.O. on March 4, 1987, and refer to Administration for inclusion into the City's discussions with the Ministry of Government Services.

E. Royal Canadian Legion

That City Council approve the request to continue operating Legion Loto and Legion Nevada in 1990.

COMMUNICATIONS**1. Le Village BIA-projects/estimates 25.10**

It was moved by Aldermen Green and Backs that the request from Le Village for additional funding in 1989 be denied as the request is not in accordance with the criteria approved by Council.

2. Two-way left turn lanes 30.30.08

It was moved by Aldermen Guindon and Green that Council approve the installation of a centre two-way left turn lane on Cornwall Centre Road between Pitt Street and Highway #138, this Fall. This will require an amendment to the Traffic By-law #069-1989.

CARRIED

3. Tender #72-89 30.20.07

It was moved by Aldermen Guindon and R. Lalonde that Tender #72-89, Lease, Lease Purchase, of pick-up trucks and vans for the department of Public Works, be awarded to Healy Motor Sales (1985) Ltd. for a period of 61 months at a total price of \$638,620.95, (including tax) being the low bidder meeting all of the tender specifications.

4. P.A.C. no. 8-1 Icaro Olivieri 30.40.15

It was moved by Aldermen Lebano and T. Lalonde that the subject property be redesignated from "Urban Residential" to "Community Commercial" and rezoned from "Manufacturing 10" to "Community Commercial", and that the requirement for a Market and Planning Study be waived.

5. P.A.C. no. 8-2 J.F.Markell 30.40.15

This item was withdrawn.

6. Proposed PCB Projects 20.09.

It was moved by Aldermen Guindon and Green that Council concur with Ontario Hydro's request to move 32,216 litres of contaminated oil to a temporary PCB storage site as outlined on the attached site plan; and that this temporary storage site be decommissioned once the decontamination project is completed.

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Poirier and T. Lalonde that Ontario Hydro and the Ministry of Environment hold a public meeting to inform the public on how the transportation of PCBs' from 12 of its locations outside of Cornwall, will be controlled.

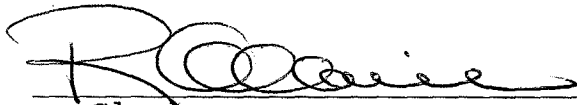

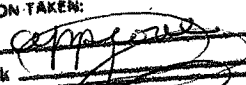
