## COMMUNICATION

### 1. PROJECTS TO BE DEBENTURED

### 2. WASTE REDUCTION STRATEGY

It was moved by Aldermen Dean Hollingsworth and Chuck Charlebois that curbside collection of leaf waste take place on three occasions in the Fall of 1994.

It was then moved by Aldermen Dick Aubry and Chuck Charlebois that Council authorize Administration to commence the tender process for the curbside collection of leaf waste on two occasions in the Fall of 1994. The collection program is based on the use of compostable paper bags and/or returnable containers by the household as set out in this report. Funding has been allocated in the 1994 Waste Reduction Budget.

### 3. SKATEBOARD FACILITY

It was moved by Aldermen Tom Green and Dean Hollingsworth:

1. That the proposed indoor skateboard facility be deferred at this time and presented at the 1995 capital budget deliberations.
2. That the Recreation Advisory Committee request City Council to authorize administration to seek out potential commercial corporate sponsors to determine interest, just prior to, or during 1995 budget submissions.
3. As an alternative, the department of Parks and Recreation would be prepared to recommend two areas for skateboarding:
  - a) We provide one asphalt pad 250 ft x 180 ft located behind the Water Street Arena to be utilized Saturday and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. from June 15 under the end of August.
  - b) During the months of July and August we provide skateboarding indoors at the Bob Turner Centre on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

**4. ON-STREET PARKING RESTRICTIONS**

It was moved by Aldermen Dick Aubry and Aimé LeBlanc:

1. a) That parking be prohibited on the west side of York Street from First Street West to a point 20 metres north (corner restriction).  
b) That parking be prohibited on the west side of York Street from First Street to a point 10 metres south (corner restriction).
2. That parking be prohibited on the south side of First Street (west) from a point 25 metres east of Mulberry Avenue to a point 55 metres east of Mulberry Avenue.
3. That parking be prohibited on the east side of York Street from Third Street West to a point 25 metres north.
4. a) That parking be prohibited on the east side of Churchill Street from Fifteenth Street (west) to a point 20 metres south of Fifteenth Street (east).  
b) That Parking be prohibited on the north side of Fifteenth Street (east) from Churchill Street to a point 20 metres east (corner restriction).  
c) That parking be prohibited at all times on the west side of Churchill Street from Fifteenth Street (west) to a point 25 metres south (corner restriction).  
d) That parking be prohibited from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday on the west side of Churchill Street from a point 25 metres south of Fifteenth Street (west) to a point 40 metres further south.
5. That parking be prohibited at all times on the south side of Walton Street from McConnell Avenue to Prince Arthur Street.
6. a) That parking be prohibited at all times on the south side of Walton Street from Alice Street to a point 25 metres east.  
b) That parking be prohibited at all times on the west side of Alice Street from Walton Street to a point 25 metres north.

**5. VISITOR INFORMATION CENTER**

It was moved by Aldermen Aimé LeBlanc and Tom Green that City Council grant permission to the Cornwall Chamber of Commerce to operate a Visitor Information Centre near the entrance to the Civic Complex.
