PRESENTATION

1. **Magnetic Fields from Cedar Rapids Transmission's LesCèdres-Cornwall Line**

Dr. Robert Bourdeau presented to Council the Eastern Ontario Health Unit's report regarding the possible health impacts of the magnetic fields generated by the new Cedar Rapids Transmission's Les Cèdes-Cornwall Line. The report is not complete, but is presented to Council at this time because the Equivalent Review Process for this transmission line is due to end October 15, 2001.

The proposal which was originally presented to Council is not exactly what is now being planned by Cedar Rapids. The final proposal will consist of twelve conductors, not six as was originally stated, and will make up 923 MW, not 350 MW. This has a definite impact on the magnetic fields that will be produced by this line.

Dr. Bourdeau notes that this line which will transverse Cornwall will only benefit Cedar Rapids Transmission and the United States. There is no benefit to the citizens of Cornwall. The present line has 230 MW. Cornwall utilizes only 100 of this. Therefore, this new line will provide double what is required by the City.

For children, the maximum acceptable amount of exposure to magnetic fields should be in the vicinity of 0.2 μ T. The Health Unit is in the process of measuring the amount of exposure children in the vicinity would be subjected to once the line is completed.

Dr. Bourdeau points out that there are a number of ways to reduce the magnetic fields that would not be costly but that would need to be planned. In addition, there are towers and transmission lines that are more esthetically pleasing and that the City may want to consider in the long term.

In summary, Dr. Bourdeau notes that there are health, esthetics and economic issues of interest to the citizens of Cornwall in this proposed project. He recommends that Council considers asking Cedar Rapids to extend the response period to the Review Process so that the Health Unit has an opportunity to complete its study and table it to Council. This will allow Council to make the proper recommendations.

Moved by Councillors Naresh Bhargava and André Rivette that Administration contact Cedar Rapids and request a two-month extension for the time frame to submit an objection to the Cedar Rapids Transmission project and that the Ministry of the Environment be provided a copy of the presentation by Dr. Robert Bourdeau.

DELEGATIONS

1. Youth Center/*Maison des Jeunes*

Guy R. Lalonde, Roxanne Bouchard and Lisa Boyer from the Youth Center/*Maison des Jeunes* informed Council regarding the activities and mandate of the Youth Center. The speakers expanded on the themes of the Center's accomplishments, its dreams and its hopes.

The Center provides activities to youths aged 9 to 18 years. They have received some funds through the United Way, the Royal Bank's After School Programs for an informal tutoring and peer mentoring program and the Justice Department for a crime and violence prevention program. In addition, the Center has held some fundraising activities such as dances for grade school children and car washes.

Presently, the Center is opened for sixteen hours a week. Their goal is to increase their hours of operations to twenty-six hours a week, to develop a job shadowing program and a Youth Drop-in Center in the area of Glenview Heights.

The Center needs the support from the community and agencies to continue its operations and to expand its activities.

The presenters took this opportunity to thank Council for its support to the Youth Center.

2. Police Board - Business Plan

The Police Board's Business Plan was presented to Council by Chief Anthony Repa, Board Chair Judy Bobka and Jeremy Hill, Consultant.

In their presentation, the speakers explained the Cornwall Community Police Service's mission, vision and values. The Service's future focus includes:

- Crime prevention and community satisfaction;
- Emergency response and public order maintenance;
- Victim's assistance;
- Traffic safety;
- Infrastructure; and
- Information technology - resource stewardship.

The speakers went on to present the Service's development process for its strategic agenda and business plan.

There will be a town hall meeting on October 29th from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Civic Complex to allow the Police Board to present its plan in greater detail and to solicit suggestions. Afterwards, a final version of the document will be produced.

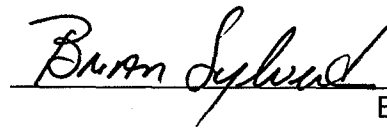
