PRESENTATION

1. Gateway Riders Incorporated, Eastern Ontario Health Unit - Health Initiative -
Mr. Daniel Landry

Mr. Daniel Landry, Health Promoter for the Eastern Ontario Health Unit, on behalf of Mr. John Bolton Program Director of Gateway Riders Inc., provided a brief overview of their recent initiative that is intended to bring many positive impacts on Cornwall and its commuting population. Mr. Landry requested Council's endorsement in declaring the week of August 19th to the 23rd inclusive as the official commuting week within the City of Cornwall and that citizens be encouraged to use the Public Transit system, walk, cycle, roller-blade or car pool during this week. This initiative is being brought forward due to recent air quality and smog advisories through our region and the goal that this group has set for itself is to educate the citizens of Cornwall and area on the advantages of commuting from a global health perspective.

Mr. John Dilabio, Chair of the Cornwall Curling Club, along with Mr. Bill Dickey, appeared before council this evening to provide an overview of the Cornwall Curling Center and its request for support towards the construction of a new facility.

Mr. Dickey indicated that the Curling Center was a non-profit organization that has provided a facility and programs to residents within this community since 1884. The present facility is over 50 years and in a state of disrepair. It was noted that a new facility to the Civic Complex would bring critical mass to the existing facility.

Mr. Dilabio continued in requesting a commitment by the City on receiving Superbuild funds committed to the City from upper levels of government to kick start the development of a new Curling Club Facility.

CLOSED MEETINGS - Code of Ethic

1. *"Upon completion of closed meetings of the Council, the decisions of the Council with respect to any of the above enumerated items, and directions to City Administration in accordance therewith, shall then be reported publicly by Council to the extent that the public interest permits;*
2.
 - i) *The response of Members to enquiries about any matter dealt with by Council at a closed meeting, prior to it being reported publicly, shall be "no comment", or words to that effect;*
 - ii) *Any violation of this regulation will result in exclusion of the offending Member from future closed meetings of Council and that Member no longer being provided with correspondence, materials or information proposed to be dealt with by Council at a closed meeting;*

- iii) *The determination of whether or not a violation of the closed meeting provisions of this By-law and the length of the exclusion from closed meetings, if so determined, shall be made by Council at a closed meeting, and the issues shall be considered by Council prior to the affected Member being excluded from any closed meeting. The results of Council's deliberations shall be reported out publicly;*
- iv) *If the purported violation of the closed meeting provisions of this By-law by more than one Member is to be considered, a separate resolution of Council with respect to each affected Member is to be adopted;*
- v) *Notwithstanding paragraph (b) (iii), the Member affected shall not be permitted to vote on a motion respecting his purported violation of the closed meeting provision of the procedure By-law, his exclusion from closed meetings, or the length of any such exclusion.*
- vi) *The release of any information about matters dealt with by Council at a closed meeting shall be by the Mayor or his delegate only;*
- vii) *Notwithstanding Subsection (b (i)) , unless Council by vote determines otherwise, upon the public reporting of any closed meeting agenda item, any individual Members may express their own personal position on the item, but shall not refer to or discuss the specific positions or opinions (written or verbal) of other Members or of City Staff;*
- viii) *Agendas or any items thereon for consideration by Council at a closed meeting shall not be released to the public in advance of the closed meeting.*
- ix) *Subject to the Mayor, in consultation with the City Clerk, making adjustments to the timing in order to best accommodate the closed meeting agenda, closed meetings of Council will generally commence in advance of the regular council meeting at 5:00 p.m.*

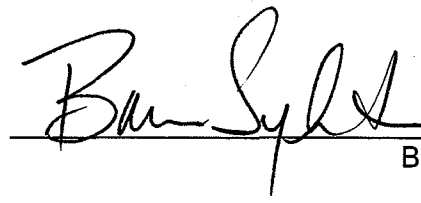
