PRESENTATIONS

1. Building Construction and Building Maintenance Program

Mr. Dan Lortie and Lucien Lalonde from Lincien College made a presentation regarding a Building Construction and Building Maintenance Program. To compliment the Catholic District School Boards initiative through the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program, St. Matthew Catholic Learning Centre is interested in delivering a special course geared to promote skilled trades in construction technology. Designed to combine in-school secondary school and college theory with out-of-school learning through co-operative education, the Program will give students a better understanding of the construction industry. The out-of-school component will consist of students participating in co-operative education placements with area contractors in the field of their choice. The goal of the Program is to give students an academic base, followed by safety and code book training and, ultimately, a placement. This program has been designed to meet the needs expressed by local contractors in our community.

The goals of the Program, the target audience, the Ministry Guidelines and the Programs partners were all detailed

Mr. Lalonde of Lincien College explained that, over an eight-month period, starting in September, 2003, twenty to twenty-five students will have an opportunity to earn eight credits towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

1. St. Lawrence River Institute - Progress Fund

Tom Kaneb, President of the St. Lawrence River Institute of Environmental Sciences, provided an update on the construction of its new research centre and the new activities with University of Ottawa that are resulting from its new home. Mr. Kaneb indicated that construction is ahead of schedule and on budget. He also indicated that the Institute has received a grant to hire a Consultant to prepare a five-year strategic plan and that candidates are currently being interviewed.

Mr. Kaneb requested that Council release the second half of the \$500,000.00 Progress Fund in September or October of 2003 rather than in 2004 to avoid the costs of bank financing for construction.

The original Motion of January 13, 2003, reads as follows:

“That Council support option (B) of the report as follows:

- (B) That Council determine that the request from the St. Lawrence River Institute does meet the qualifying requirements of the existing Progress Fund by-law and that Council supports an allocation of \$500,000 over a 2 year period commencing in 2003. And further, that the St. Lawrence River Institute provide for the residual ownership to vest with the City in the event of the closure of the Institute for any reason within 10 years of the date of the City's investment.”

2. Same Sex Marriage

On June 10, 2003, the Ontario Court of Appeal replaced the common law definition of marriage to “the voluntary union for life of two persons” from the old definition of “the voluntary union of one man and one woman to the exclusion of all others.

Pastor Rick Hiemstra and other Cornwall religious institutions oppose same sex marriage. Pastor Hiemstra gave their reasons for the opposition and called on Council to recognize the traditional definition of marriage, the definition of marriage that has been so for thousands of years, the definition of marriage that all major world religions hold in common, the definition of marriage that makes possible the procreation.

Pastor Hiemstra requested that Council pass a Resolution urging the Canadian Government to pass legislation recognizing marriage as an exclusively heterosexual institution.

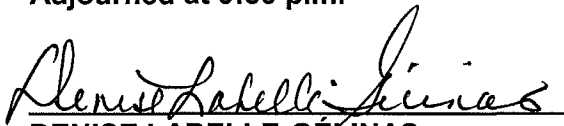
