PRESENTATIONS

1. Canadian Medical Association

Dr. Danny Tomblor, on behalf of the Canadian Medical Association, presented Mayor Brian Sylvester with the inaugural CMA Award for Excellence in Health Promotion.

On August 20, 2003, The Canadian Medical Associate launched the CMA Award for Excellence in Health Promotion to recognize individuals and organizations, outside of the health sector, who have made a significant contribution towards a healthy population.

The first annual CMA Award for Excellence in Health Promotion has been presented to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities in recognition of those municipalities across Canada that have passed By-laws banning smoking in 100 per cent of all indoor public places as of July 1, 2003.

Physicians know too well the devastating impact tobacco use has on health and have been warning Canadians about the hazards of second-hand smoke. The CMA applauds the tremendous leadership taken by municipalities who have implemented smoke-free By-laws. This step will protect the health of millions of Canadians in our towns and cities.

CMA's vision of a healthy population will only be achieved through the actions of all Canadians. For consideration for this award, nominees must have contributed to the improvement of health through health promotion actions, initiatives or increased public awareness. Monique Rosa, Club President of The Glendaler's Winter Sports Club, gave a brief background of the Club. The Glendaler's Winter Sports Club is an ATV/Snowmobile club that was founded over thirty years ago with a handful of members. Over 470 members now form the Club. The Club is a non-profit organization and work is done on a voluntary basis. It has a clubhouse in Summerstown and approximately 125km of groomed trails which go from Cornwall to Williamstown, Summerstown, Lancaster, Green Valley Alexandria and St. Telesphore. At this time, most of the trails operate during the winter months, with only 25% of the trails open all year round. The Club is able to organize fundraisers to support charities such as Crime Stoppers, Easter Seals and CNIB. Over the past few years The Glendaler's Winter Sports Club has raised over \$35,000.00 for these organizations.

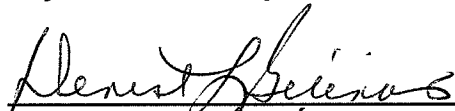

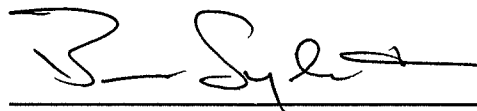
