## GENERAL CONSENT

### ADOPTION OF MINUTES

The following Minutes were presented for adoption. The Minutes of Regular Council Meeting #32-2004 of Monday, October 25, 2004, stand approved as amended.

### PRESENTATIONS

#### 1. Raisin Region Conservation Authority

Mr. Roger Houde, P.Eng., General Manager, made a brief Power Point presentation to members of Council raising several issues facing Conservation Authorities across Ontario. As a result of significant reductions in provincial funding for provincially delegated responsibilities, Conservation Authorities have had to absorb the funding shortfall and forced to look at other sources of funding. Historically, the province shared equally in provincially mandated programs.

Council were urged to support the Conservation Authority in asking the government to re-invest funding in areas of Provincial Interest which were specifically excluded in 1997. Three specific areas identified were municipal plan review, floodplan regulations and shoreline management of which programs were previously funded. As a result, a total estimated 2005 shortfall is identified at \$13.8 million.

Mr. Houde concluded his presentation by indicating that it was not the Conservation Authority's intention to increase funding but to enhance the delivery by re-establishing equitable cost sharing, re-invest in programs of provincial interest and meet today's requirements and tomorrow's challenges.

A request to members of Council to endorse the attached municipal resolution, as members of the Raisin Region Conservation Authority would support their efforts in obtaining the much needed funding by the Provincial Government.

## 3. Raisin Region Conservation Authority

**WHEREAS** the Corporation of the City of Cornwall is a member of the Raisin Region Conservation Authority; and

**WHEREAS** the Conservation Authority works in partnership with its watershed municipalities to implement community-based, practical solutions to a range of natural resource issues including provincially delegated responsibilities for the implementation of flood and erosion control programs for the protection of life and property; and

**WHEREAS** the Province has previously committed to paying 50% of flood and erosion control programs and other related eligible costs as defined in the 1997 Policy and Procedures Manual, but has not met that funding commitment; and

**WHEREAS** the Province of Ontario, when establishing new policies and procedures in 1997 to define the level of funding to support its partnership with Conservation Authorities, omitted: (1) Municipal Plan Review, (2) the implementation of the Conservation Authority Act Section 28 Regulation, and (3) Shoreline Management as eligible activities for funding assistance by the Province; and

**WHEREAS** predictable, stable funding (adjusted for inflation) is critical to successful program delivery.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Corporation of the City of Cornwall endorse the report entitled "Submission to the Minister of Natural Resources: Re-Investment in Ontario's Conservation Authorities – Now and In the Future" which requests: (1) a reinvestment in Conservation Authorities by the Province based on definitions within the 1997 Policy and Procedures Manual, (2) a re-establishment of funding for items deemed of provincial interest currently excluded from transfer payment funding; and (3) implementation of annual Consumer Price Index adjustments retroactive to 2002;

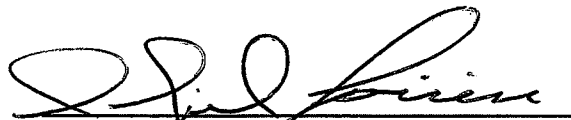
